Community Health Assessment Addendum Public Health District 2 Nez Perce and Latah County Listening Session Report

May 19th, 2021

INTRODUCTION

Seven professionals in PHD 2 representing substance abuse prevention, law enforcement, post-secondary education, the public health district, and the Boys and Girls Clubs participated in this listening session. Participants were assured that their input is confidential and would not be linked to their names in the listening session reports.

HIGHLIGHTS

Some primary themes emerging from the PHD 2 Listening Session included:

- Begin tobacco education in elementary school, and include resources/education for parents
- Focus on increasing tobacco free spaces, also promoting tobacco free community norms
- The community needs more tobacco prevention and cessation information, especially for vaping

QUESTIONS

1) Do you think tobacco use is a cause of concern in Idaho? Do you think it is increasing?

- Most participants replied a three or four for the general community, and a four or five for youth, especially with regard to vaping
- Postsecondary students in Idaho have higher rates than their peers in other states, but rates decreased 2019 to 2020
- Tobacco is often used in social settings: if the number of parties can be decreased, there will be less tobacco use
- Chew and e-cigarettes are areas of concern on the college campus
- College student cigarette use is in line with national statistics
- Vaping is continuing to increase in the community
- · Tobacco use has definitely increased in the past few years, mostly vaping
- Access to vaping has increased in Lewiston: there are three or four new vape shops, and shops are close to campus

2) What barriers or challenges does your community face when it comes to tobacco use?

- Lewiston's increase in vape shops: trying to combat by educating students about vaping
- Enforcement/preventing sales to underage youth is challenging: others are buying for minors, lack resources to properly monitor activity; would like grants to increase resources for this
- Access is out of control: for example, there is a gas station that sells vaping devices right next to the school
- There is little access to prevention information in rural communities
- On campus, have observed the perception that vaping isn't very harmful
- Attitudes and perceptions are not always supportive of smoke free campus/places: general attitude of acceptance that it is not a big deal to use tobacco
- The legislature has reduced fines and consequences when students are caught using tobacco at school: the \$74.00 ticket is perceived as not a big deal by most parents and students; not many schools offer or utilize classes as an alternative to tickets/fines
- Tobacco use is regionally and generationally normalized

3) What assets does your community have that could support prevention and cessation outcomes?

- Boys and Girls Clubs received a grant to provide education to kids
- Radio ads
- Billboards
- The public health district has a hard time reaching small, rural communities, but has community partners to support cessation services in small areas: would like to see more uptake of these services
- Tobacco free campus policy has decreased tobacco use
- Cessation services through the public health district are utilized by a good mix of college staff and college students
- A community education approach to enforcement, rather than providing a ticket right away
- In the past there were strong coalitions in Moscow and campus and community partnerships: these have declined over the past couple of years; the college is very supportive and open to coalitions and collaboration
- Some health teachers have built tobacco prevention information into their curriculum starting in 8th grade: would like to see this start at 5th or 6th grade, including how to balance tobacco information with other instruction time
- Parks in Lewiston are smoke free
- SRO's doing middle school class presentations every quarter for 6th and 7th graders
- The Quitline and 8 weeks of free NRT: currently highlight these services at college events and also hand out quit kits
- Campus tobacco litter cleanup events: about three times per year
- Project Filter providing athletes to hire for presentations

4) What do you see as your role in preventing tobacco use?

- Providing education to middle school and high school students
- Reinforcing zero tolerance at school: students automatically received citation
- School sanctions include three days of suspension, some attend substance use classes
- Prevention education for college students
- Linking students to cessation services
- Ensuring tobacco free is embedded into the college culture through signs, orientation packages, etc.
- Performing assessments of substance use trends

5) To what extent does tobacco use harm young people in your community? How? How has vaping impacted youth in your community? What trends have you noticed?

- Respondents rated this question as a four out of five or slightly higher
- Long term health effects: the longer tobacco is used, the harder it is to quit, and the higher likelihood of long-term health consequences
- Tobacco use is a gateway to other substances like marijuana
- Impacts youth behaviors, ability to get scholarships, ability to get into the military if you have a record of infractions
- Middle and high school athletes who vape experience decreased performance, excludes them from athletics, and often moves them toward troublesome circles/activities
- Although many use to help alleviate mental health challenges, it can make them worse: for example, anxiety and depression
- Tobacco use becomes a vicious cycle to manage when used to alleviate mental health challenges
- Couldn't serve kids well during COVID: more teens were on the streets; need to get kids back into afterschool programs
- 80 to 90% of school problems/violations have stemmed from vaping

6) Do you feel your community has enough information about the harms of tobacco use? What is working well in communicating this? What resources do you need to support the dissemination of information?

- All respondents indicated either a two or three out of five, indicating significant room for improvement
- Other community issues are receiving more focus: are higher priority than tobacco
- Messaging/PSA's for addressing tobacco are not a high priority in the community
- Many perceive vaping as a good or healthy alternative to tobacco
- Lacking good resources on vaping
- Need to get the message out better: for example, many parents vape and don't perceive it as harmful
- At the college, most tobacco information shared is about cessation services
- When providing prevention information, it is like preaching to the choir: don't see much tobacco use at the Moscow college campus

7) What role do you think the local community plays in convincing young people in the community to not start using tobacco?

- Take a norming approach: policy and campaigns to promote tobacco free as a norm
- Most parks are not yet smoke free this is a great opportunity

8) What do you think we, as a community, could do better to help young people quit vaping or using other tobacco products?

- Lewiston needs better education: opportunities include billboards, PSAS, and just generally being very visible
- Keep in mind that employee vaping is also a problem: employees lack education, including not understanding the harms of tobacco use
- The community must counteract the messaging, policies, codes, and tobacco industry marketing that continues to facilitate tobacco use
- Need to educate parents: they don't know all the ways kids can use or sneak vaping at school
- There are not enough parents showing up when education sessions are held those who
 do show up are often not the ones who really need to be there
- Need higher fines and required classes for students who are caught with tobacco at school: parents and students should both attend classes
- Continue to collaborate with Greek Life through workshops and other house activities to address vaping increase and other tobacco use
- Continue to promote all sororities being tobacco free, including parties: contributes to norming
- Must refocus college campus efforts after COVID

9) As a community, what are we doing well in supporting young people who vape and use other tobacco products in quitting/providing education?

- We have cessation opportunities in every county = adequate coverage
- We have cessation opportunities on campus
- Tobacco free campus
- Promoting tobacco use prevention and cessation at college events
- Like the focus group today, bringing together like-minded individuals to talk and discuss solutions
- Lewiston's and Moscow's tobacco education presence
- SRO's in Lewiston are extremely beneficial from an education standpoint; however, schools some still don't have SRO's

10) Do you currently have any signage or communication materials related to tobacco use? What types? How effective is the signage you currently have?

- Permanent signs on all walkways, visitors, and print materials
- Campus provides policy reminders at least once a year
- Campus newsletter reminders
- Campus materials and policies have contributed to tobacco free norming; it's beneficial to have continued information for visitors and new students
- Campus signage empowers staff to reinforce policies (e.g., with parents, visitors)
- Two city parks currently have signage: there is an effort underway to implement this in the rest of the parks
- Public schools sometimes lack consistent signage and are not totally smoke free: can still smoke within 20 feet of the building
- SRO's have put posters up around the schools some of them have been taken down
- The public health district can provide more materials to the schools

11) If applicable, what successes have you experienced from having a smoke and vape free policy? How did you achieve this?

- Buy in from those most impacted: students, administration
- First university in Idaho to become completely tobacco free: contributing to success was true community collaboration including external partners, the American Lung Association calling the president's office every day, and the public health district

12) What do you think is the most effective way to reach rural Idahoans with tobacco/vaping education and messaging? Specific platforms or networks?

- Have coalition members do the education in locations where they are at: gas stations, restaurants; it's hard to accept from outsiders, plus it takes time and persistence
- Leverage those native to small rural communities: are still considered outsiders after two or three decades of residency, so must look to even longer-term community members
- Many adults are "tobacco families": the best way to reach them is through robust information provided to their children
- Anti-vaping ads on Hulu/streaming services
- Focus on evidence-based programs that support resiliency, building strength and protective factors
- Intergenerational settings need wrap around supports (e.g., when dealing with anxiety)
- Social media: statewide campaigns like Be the Parents (through the Idaho Office of Drug Policy): Facebook partnership with the Idaho vandals
- Tapping into the most popular social media platforms: Facebook is not popular for kids;
 Tik Tok, Snapchat, streaks
- At the public health district, incorporate into existing adolescent pregnancy prevention education funded through school grants - includes other life skills (e.g., Reducing the Risk, Making a Difference
- College campuses
- Norming peer to peer


- 13) Given all the ideas we've discussed, what would be the most effective and practical ways to inform community members about the problems associated with tobacco use and available cessation services?
 - Implement a broad, targeted approach, addressing tobacco use from several angles: schools, billboards and e-billboards, enforcement, the legislature
 - Prioritize early education in schools
- 14) If you had unlimited resources, what would you like to see happen in your local community to support prevention and cessation of tobacco use?
 - Limit the number of tobacco shops in your community and limit where they can be located
 - Make all spaces tobacco free
 - All parents eager to engage in strengths-based approaches to life
 - Resources fortified for targeted patrol: task forces to target vape shops, increased shoulder tap operations; vape shops are targeting kids so we must target the vape shops
 - Prohibit tobacco company marketing in the community including athletic events
- 15) Is there anything else you would like to share, or any insights or takeaways from today's session?
 - Need to reinvigorate efforts now after COVID
 - Continue all partnerships with public health and try new angles
 - Continue to push for tobacco free spaces
